This Ordinance is needed to update the salary range of the Assistant Township Engineer.

The public hearing was carried from the May 14, 2026 council meeting. This Ordinance is needed due to adjustments to the cap base that were done after the introduction of Ordinance 2026-11. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2, “municipalities and counties shall be prohibited from increasing their final appropriations by more than 2.5%...” unless action is taken by the governing body to increase their final appropriations subject to the cap to the statutorily permitted 3.5%. This is the appropriation cap and is now referred to as the 1977 Budget Cap Law.

This Ordinance is needed to amend Chapter 122 entitled “Fire Prevention” adding Article IV entitled “Recreational Fires and Other Open Burn Fires”. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2026-03, FIXING THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ROBBINSVILLE FOR 2026

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:69A-180, the Township Council is obligated, by ordinance, to fix the compensation of the mayor, council members, and department heads; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:69A-43a, the salaries of all other employees of the administrative departments of the Township shall be fixed by the mayor within the general limits of the municipal budget, subject to any pertinent contractual obligations and except for any salaries of officers which are required by law to be fixed by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-165, the Township Council is obligated, by ordinance, unless otherwise provided by law, to fix the salaries, wages, or compensation to be paid to the officers and employees of the Township, including the members of the governing body and the mayor; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:9-165, the salaries, wages, or compensation fixed and determined by ordinance may, from time to time, be increased, decreased, or altered by ordinance; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of Robbinsville, County of Mercer, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION I. The salaries of the hereinafter designated Township officers and employees are attached hereto as Schedule "A".

SECTION II. Unless otherwise noted, said salaries shall be retroactive to January 1, 2026.

SECTION III. All provisions of any contract between the Township of Robbinsville and bargaining units shall be incorporated herein as though set forth in full.

SECTION IV. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of any inconsistency or conflict.

SECTION V. If any section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by the courts to be invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provisions so adjudicated, and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION VI. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

**CALENDAR YEAR 2026
ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS
AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK
(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.1 *et seq.*, provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Robbinsville in the County of Mercer finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2026 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Robbinsville Township Council hereby determines that a 3.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$317,811.29 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Robbinsville Township Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of Robbinsville, County of Mercer, State of New Jersey, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2026 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Robbinsville shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$741,559.68 and that the CY 2026 municipal budget for the Township of Robbinsville be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 122 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ROBBINSVILLE ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Robbinsville in the County of Mercer, State of New Jersey that Chapter 122 of the Code of the Township of Robbinsville is hereby amended as follows [added portions are underlined, deleted portions are strikethroughs]:

SECTION 1.

Chapter 122 – Fire Prevention.

Article IV. Recreational Fires and Other Open Burn Fires

§ 122-21 Definitions and word usage.

A. Terms defined. As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

FIREWOOD

Includes trunks and branches of trees and bushes, but does not include leaves, needles, vines, or brush smaller than two inches in diameter.

NUISANCE

Any odor, emission, or event that prevents the reasonable use and enjoyment of one's property.

OTHER OPEN BURN FIRE

The burning of yard waste, leaves, brush, vines, evergreen needles, branches smaller than two inches in diameter, treated or untreated lumber, garbage, paper products, or anything other than firewood.

RECREATIONAL FIRE

Any fire utilizing firewood or untreated lumber taking place on a residential property within the boundaries of Robbinsville Township for the purpose of providing warmth, recreation and entertainment which is contained in an outdoor fireplace, commercially manufactured chiminea or outdoor fire pit. Other containers constructed in similar manner may also be approved by the Township Fire Official. A recreational fire does not include charcoal or gas grills as may be regulated in other sections.

TREATED LUMBER

Dry wood which has milled and dried, and has been treated or combined with any petroleum product, glue, chemical, preservative, adhesive, stain, paint, or other substance.

UNTREATED LUMBER

Dry wood which has milled and dried, but which has not been treated or combined with any petroleum product, glue, chemical, preservative, adhesive, stain, paint, or other substance.

- B. Word usage. For the purpose of this article and any other ordinance or resolution heretofore or hereafter adopted, except as the context may otherwise require:
- (1) The present tense includes the past and future tenses, and the future tense includes the present.
 - (2) The singular number includes the plural, and the plural includes the singular.
 - (3) “Shall” is mandatory; “may” is permissive.
 - (4) The time within which an act is to be done shall be computed by excluding the first day and including the last day, and if the last day is a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, that day shall be excluded and the next following working day shall be the last day.
 - (5) “Writing” and “written” includes any printed, typed, written, computer-generated and any other mode of communication using paper or similar material which is in general use, including but not limited to data sheets, data processing cards, photographs, photographic negatives, photo records, tape recordings, wire recordings, transcripts of recordings, as well as legible handwriting.
 - (6) The feminine shall include the masculine. The masculine shall include the feminine.

§112-22 Recreational Fire Regulations

- A. Recreational fires in approved containers as set forth herein shall be allowed without a permit at one and two-family owner-occupied residential structures, duplexes, townhomes, subject to the regulations contained herein.
- B. Seasoned firewood, untreated lumber, natural gas, or propane are permitted to be burned. Note: Kindling and branches under two (2) inches may be used to start a recreational fire. Unseasoned firewood, garbage, plastics, rubber, yard waste, treated lumber, leaves, or other materials which cause excessive smoke are not permitted.
- C. Fires shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) feet in diameter and two (2) feet in height and must be contained in a non-combustible chiminea, outdoor fireplace, fire pit, or other method as approved by the Township Fire Official.
- D. All openings in the chiminea, outdoor fireplace, or fire pit must be covered with wire mesh or other screening materials that will prevent the passage of sparks or embers. Fires must be kept in the rear yard at least fifteen (15) feet from any structure or combustible exterior wall and shall not be located within twenty (20) feet of lot lines.

- E. Fires must be constantly attended by a competent adult resident of the property from the time of ignition until the fire is extinguished. A fully functioning fire extinguisher with a minimum 4-A rating or other approved on-site fire extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, water barrel, or garden hose shall be readily available when any fire is ongoing. Careful consideration should be made regarding smoke travel. Should prevailing winds cause smoke to blow into a neighboring dwelling or property, the fire should be extinguished immediately.
- F. No chiminea, outdoor fireplace, fire pit or other fire container may be used on any porch, deck, balcony, or any other portion of a building; within any room or space; or under any building overhang.
- G. Recreational fires may not be permitted in certain communities governed by a Homeowners Association (HOA), including a community association, property owners' association (POA), or housing association. In those communities any rules or regulations that exceed the regulations and requirements of this ordinance shall prevail.
- H. All fires as set forth herein shall be extinguished no later than 12:00 midnight.
- I. The Fire Chief or designee, Police Officer, Township Fire Official and/or any Robbinsville Township Code Enforcement Official(s) may order any open fire, or use of a chiminea, outdoor fireplace or fire pit which creates a nuisance or perceived hazard to be extinguished.

§ 122-23 Other Open Burn Fires

- A. The open burning of yard waste, leaves, brush, vines, evergreen needles, branches smaller than 2 inches in diameter, treated or untreated lumber, garbage, paper products or anything other than firewood shall not be permitted within Robbinsville Township unless a permit has been issued by the Township Fire Official or the State of New Jersey, Division of Forestry. For permits issued the permittee must follow all current/applicable regulations set forth in the New Jersey Uniform Fire Code and/or New Jersey State Statutes related to New Jersey State Forest Fire regulations.
- B. Permits for other open burn fires are required for special permitted locations, including, but not limited to, properties used for agricultural purposes, Township or other public properties, schools, churches, or other nonprofit organizations.
- C. Other open burn fires must be kept in the rear or the property if applicable, at least fifteen (15) feet from any structure or combustible exterior wall, and shall not be located within twenty (20) feet of lot lines.
- D. Other open burn fires shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) feet in diameter and two (2) feet in height.

- E. Other open burn fires must be constantly attended by a competent adult resident of the property from the time of ignition until the fire is extinguished. A fully functioning fire extinguisher with a minimum 4-A rating or other approved on-site fire extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, water barrel, or garden hose shall be readily available when any fire is ongoing. Careful consideration should be made regarding smoke travel. Should prevailing winds cause smoke to blow into a neighboring dwelling or property, the fire should be extinguished immediately.
- F. All other open burn fires as set forth herein shall be extinguished no later than 12:00 midnight.
- G. The Fire Chief or designee, Police Officer, Township Fire Official and/or any Robbinsville Township Code Enforcement Official(s) may order any other open burn fire which creates a nuisance to be extinguished.

§ 122-24 Enforcement

- A. The Fire Chief or designee, Fire Official, Fire Department, Police Department, and/or any Robbinsville Township Code Enforcement Official(s) may enforce the provisions of this ordinance including, but not limited to ordering the extinguishment of any recreational and/or other open burn fire if constituting a hazardous condition or if said fire is causing smoke emissions to become a nuisance to surrounding properties.
- B. No recreational fires or other open burn fires shall be permitted during periods of extreme wildfire risk as prescribed by the State of New Jersey, State Forest Fire Service, and/or local Fire Officials. During these periods, recreational fires and other open burn fires are not permitted under any circumstances and may be subject to immediate violations and penalties.

§ 122-25 Exemptions

Nothing contained in this article shall apply to Recreational or Open Burn Fires located within Newtown Village. All Recreational or Open Burn Fires located within Newtown Village shall be governed by the Newtown Village Community Rules and Regulations established pursuant to § 164-3 of the Township Code.

§ 122-26 Violations and Penalties

- A. Failure to comply with the Fire, Police, or Code Enforcement orders shall constitute a violation of this Chapter/Article in addition to any/all criminal and/or regulatory violations. Violations may be cited against the property owner and/or individuals responsible for maintenance of the hazardous condition. The Fire Chief or designee, Fire Official, Fire Department, Police Department, and/or any Robbinsville Township Code Enforcement Official(s) may issue a citation, violation, or penalty pursuant to this ordinance.

B. Any person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalties provided in Chapter I, Article II, General Penalty. Each day such a violation is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as such.

SECTION 2.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3.

If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall remain valid and effective.

This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 80 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ROBBINSVILLE ENTITLED "HISTORIC PRESERVATION" SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE III ENTITLED "HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Robbinsville in the County of Mercer, State of New Jersey that Chapter 80 of the Code of the Township of Robbinsville is hereby amended as follows [added portions are underlined, deleted portions are strikethroughs]:

SECTION 1.

Chapter 80- Historic Preservation

**ARTICLE III
Historic Preservation Commission**

§ 80-7. Establishment members.

A. Establishment. There is hereby established within the Township of Robbinsville an Historic Preservation Commission (HPC), whose members shall serve without compensation. The Historic Preservation Commission shall act as the Historic Preservation Commission pursuant to the Municipal Land Use Law N.J.S.A. 40:55D-107 et seq.

§ 80-9. Historic Preservation Commission officers.

Elections. The Historic Preservation Commission shall annually elect a Chair and Vice-Chair from its members and select a Secretary, ~~who shall be a municipal employee who may or may not be a member of the historic preservation commission or a municipal employee.~~ (See N.J.S.A. 40:55D-107c.) The terms of the elected officers shall run for a one-year period beginning in January of each year.

SECTION 2.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3.

If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall remain valid and effective.

SECTION 4.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

**ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2025-45 THE SALE OF A PORTION OF
BLOCK 1, LOT 65.02 IN THE TOWNSHIP OF ROBBINSVILLE, COUNTY OF
MERCER**

WHEREAS, the Township of Robbinsville (“Township”) is the current owner of property identified as Block 1, Lot 65.02 on the Tax Maps of Robbinsville Township, more commonly identified as the Kushner Tract (“Property”); and

WHEREAS, the Township acquired the Property in 2010 for the public purpose of an anticipated global redevelopment of Town Center South; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the acquisition of the Property it was determined that the global redevelopment of Town Center South was likely not financially feasible as a result of economic, environmental, transportation, and other limitations, and that redevelopment of Town Center South would best be accomplished through smaller redevelopment projects; and

WHEREAS, the Property is located in an Area in Need of Redevelopment (“Redevelopment Area”) as established pursuant to Resolution 2010-202; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(c), the Township may sell real property not needed for public use by private sale to a private developer when acting in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-8g, the Township may lease or convey property or improvements to any other party, without public bidding and at such prices and upon such terms as it deems reasonable, provided that the lease or conveyance is made in conjunction with a redevelopment plan; and

WHEREAS, the public purpose for which the Property was acquired by the Township no longer exists and the Township no longer needs the Property for such purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to convey an approximate 14.19-acre portion of the Property (“Portion”) to be redeveloped in accordance with the “Amended and Restated Redevelopment Plan, Town Center South Redevelopment Area” prepared by Stuart B. Wiser, P.P., AICP of ARH Associates and dated September 11, 2025 (“Redevelopment Plan”), such Portion to be officially determined by survey and subdivision; and

WHEREAS, Meridia Robbinsville 33, Urban Renewal, LLC, a redeveloper under N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 *et seq.*, has offered to purchase the Portion for \$7,4,72,167.00, pursuant to section 2.7 of the Redevelopment Agreement dated June 11, 2024, for the purposes of redevelopment in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that it is in the best interests of the Township and its residents to sell the Portion to Meridia Robbinsville 33, Urban Renewal, LLC for the aforesaid purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Robbinsville, County of Mercer, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1.
