Built Environment Grant - The Notice of Intent has been filed for this grant. Hopefully, we'll know something by Jan. 27th.
Fire Chief Appointment - Recommending Jay Woodard.
Street Scape Grant - Landscaping will be the last phase and that is currently under way.
Lonnie Taylor - Newly elected Comm. for the 4th District, replacing Grace Thomas.
Courthouse Flooring - Flooring should be completed in December.
Codes and Zoning - Rosalie Myhan has been hired as assistant for this office.
Community Thanksgiving - This was held Nov. 18th. This year the meals were prepared and delivered to our 1st Responders as a Thank You for all that they do.
Free Flu Shots - The Health Dept. organized a drive-thru Flu Shot vaccination. This worked very well and will be good practice for when the Covid-19 vaccinations become available.

 - A. **Steering** - Met Nov. 5th. They are still working with the Historical Society regarding the windows for the courthouse. Discussed funds for the Planning Office, changes to the personnel policy, reviewed budget amendments, and upcoming appointments. Reviewed Mark Beeler's resignation for the Water Utility Board and Industrial Dev. Board. Also discussed, OSHA Res., 2nd Rdg. of IRC Codes Ord., and Jay Woodard's interview for Fire Chief.

- B. **Budget and Finance** - Met Nov. 16th. Reviewed the Trustee's Report and Financials for Oct. Reviewed and recommended approval of Budget Amendments.
- C. **Education** - Met Nov. 9th. Met and were updated on the Middle School Roof Project. Dr. Satterfield presented the Schools first quarter fiscal 2020-21 Financial report. They also discussed the COVID-19 situation and what to expect going forward.

**RESOLUTION AMENDING THE HARTSVILLE/TROUSDALE COUNTY GOVERNMENT
PERSONNEL POLICY TO INCLUDE A SICK LEAVE POLICY SPECIFICALLY FOR COVID 19
AND TO RESTORE ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE**

WHEREAS, the Hartsville/Trousdale County Metropolitan Government is required to develop its own personnel and office policies; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County Commission to present an updated version of Personnel Policies for all employees of Hartsville/Trousdale County Government excluding those employees working in the School System which has their own personnel policies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Hartsville/Trousdale County Commission that an amendment be made to the Hartsville/Trousdale County Metropolitan Government Personnel Policy to include a new Sick Leave Benefit specifically for COVID-19 related sick leave and to restore the Administrative Leave back to its original form.

1. Amendment to Section V-Benefits, Subsection E Sick Leave

a. See Attached documents

2. Restore Administrative Leave Section V-Benefits, Subsection K by removing the second paragraph applicable to administrative leave related to COVID-19.

a. Subsection K shall now read as "Absence with pay for administrative purposes may be granted by the employer so long as funding is available for such leave. Such leave must be for a good cause as determined by the employer. This leave shall not exceed three (3) working days per year unless exceptional circumstances exist."

AMENDMENT TO SECTION V BENEFITS, SUBSECTION E SICK LEAVE

COVID-19 SICK LEAVE POLICY

Eligibility:

All current full and part-time employees scheduled but unable to work (or telework) between the dates of January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021 due to one of the following reasons are eligible for COVID-19 sick leave:

1. The employee is subject to a federal, state, or local quarantine or isolation order related to COVID-19. A copy of the federal, state, or local quarantine or isolation order related to COVID-19 applicable to the employee or the name of the government entity that issued the order must be submitted to support the employee's COVID-19 sick leave request.
2. The employee has been advised by a licensed health care provider to quarantine or self-isolate due to concerns related to COVID-19. Written documentation by a health care provider advising the employee to quarantine or self-isolate due to concerns related to COVID-19 or the name of the provider who advised the employee must be submitted to support the employee's COVID-19 sick leave request.

Amount of COVID-19 Sick Leave:

Eligible employees have up to ten (10) working days of COVID-19 sick leave available to use for qualifying reasons.

For employees with varying hours, one of two methods for computing the number of hours paid will be used:

- If the employee has worked 6 months or more, the average number of hours that the employee was scheduled per day over the 6-month period ending on the date on which the employee takes leave, including hours for which the employee took leave of any type.
- If the employee has worked less than 6 months, the expected number of hours to be scheduled per day at the time of hire.

Consecutive COVID-19 Sick Leave.

Because all other reasons for COVID-19 sick leave could potentially expose an employee or others in the workplace to the virus, once an employee begins taking leave for reasons 1-2 above, the employee must use the permitted days of leave consecutively until the employee no longer has a qualifying reason to take COVID-19 sick leave.

Rate of Pay:

COVID-19 sick leave will be paid at the employee's regular rate of pay without consideration of overtime pay.

Interaction with Other Paid Leave:

The employee may use COVID-19 sick leave under this policy before using any other accrued paid time off for the qualifying reasons stated above.

Procedure for Requesting COVID-19 Sick Leave:

Employees must notify their **DEPARTMENT HEAD OR ELECTED OFFICIAL** of the need and specific reason for leave under this policy as soon as possible on the first day of their COVID-19 sick leave absence. A COVID-19 Sick Leave Request Form will be provided to all employees. Verbal notification will be accepted until practicable to provide written notice.

COVID-19 sick leave must be approved by the employee's **DEPARTMENT HEAD OR ELECTED OFFICIAL** in the same manner as all approved leave requests using the approved COVID-19 Sick Leave Request Form

Once COVID-19 sick leave has begun, the employee and his or her supervisor must determine reasonable procedures for the employee to report every three (3) working days on the employee's status and intent to continue to receive COVID-19 sick leave.

During a period of COVID-19 sick leave, the employee must certify that the employee will not work for another employer during what would have been the employee's normal work hours for the Hartsville/Trousdale County Government. An employee who falsely certifies they will not work for another employer during those normal work hours, and does in fact work for another employer, will be subject to discipline under Section VI.

Documentation required for COVID-19 sick leave to be paid.

The employee must submit to their **DEPARTMENT HEAD OR ELECTED OFFICIAL** the following documents (if applicable):

- Any quarantine order, self-isolation order, doctor note, or test results should be submitted via email, text or fax to the employee's **DEPARTMENT HEAD OR ELECTED OFFICIAL** as soon as possible after receipt, but no later than 24 hours after the documentation is received.
- signed leave request form; and
- return to work form.

All required documentation must be stapled to the employee's timesheet and submitted to the Mayor's Office along with the employee's timesheet.

IF THE REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION IS NOT PROVIDED TO THE MAYOR'S OFFICE AT THE SAME TIME AS THE EMPLOYEE'S TIMESHEET, THE EMPLOYER WILL EXHAUST REGULAR SICK AND VACATION LEAVE OR THE EMPLOYEE WILL BE GIVEN LEAVE WITHOUT PAY.

Employees who have previously tested positive.

An employee who has previously tested positive for COVID-19 and has since recovered, may receive COVID-19 sick leave if they meet the following requirements:

1. They are showing symptoms of COVID-19; and
2. have consulted a healthcare provider; and
3. no other cause can be found for the symptoms;

OR

4. the employee tests positive for COVID-19.

The employee must submit written documentation by a licensed health care provider advising the employee to self-quarantine due to concerns related to COVID-19.

Carryover:

COVID-19 sick leave under this policy will not be provided beyond December 31, 2021. Any unused COVID-19 sick leave will not carry over to the next year or be paid out to employees and does not count toward retirement calculation for the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System.

Exhausted COVID-19 Sick Leave:

When the employee has exhausted their allotted COVID-19 sick leave is and the employee is still under orders to quarantine, the employee must use accrued leave under the FMLA policy.

Return to work.

Upon returning to work, an employee must fill out, sign and submit to the **DEPARTMENT HEAD OR ELECTED OFFICIAL** the approved COVID-19 Return To Work Form.

No Penalty:

No employee who appropriately utilizes COVID-19 sick leave under this policy will be discharged, disciplined, or discriminated against for work time missed due to this leave.

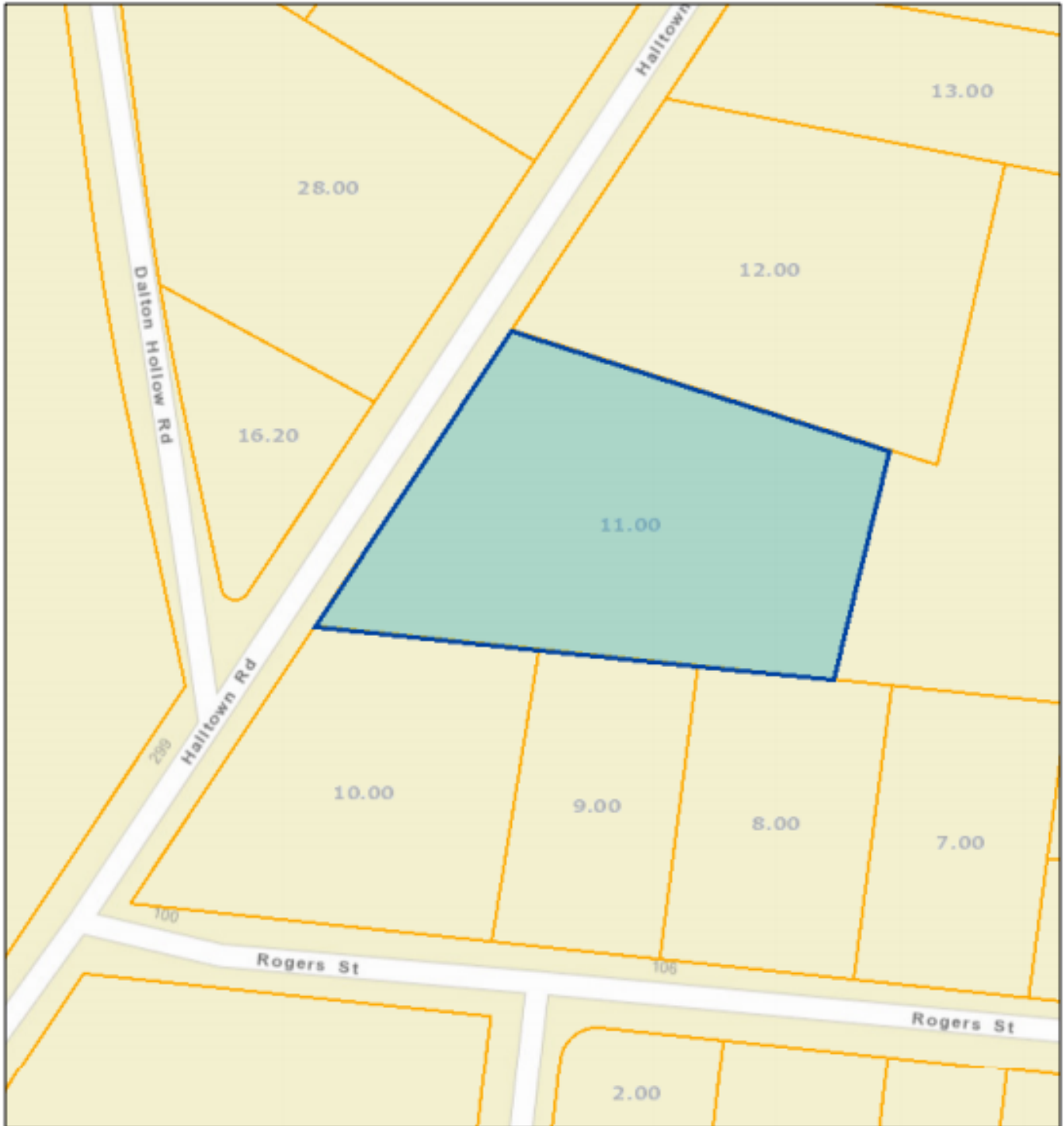

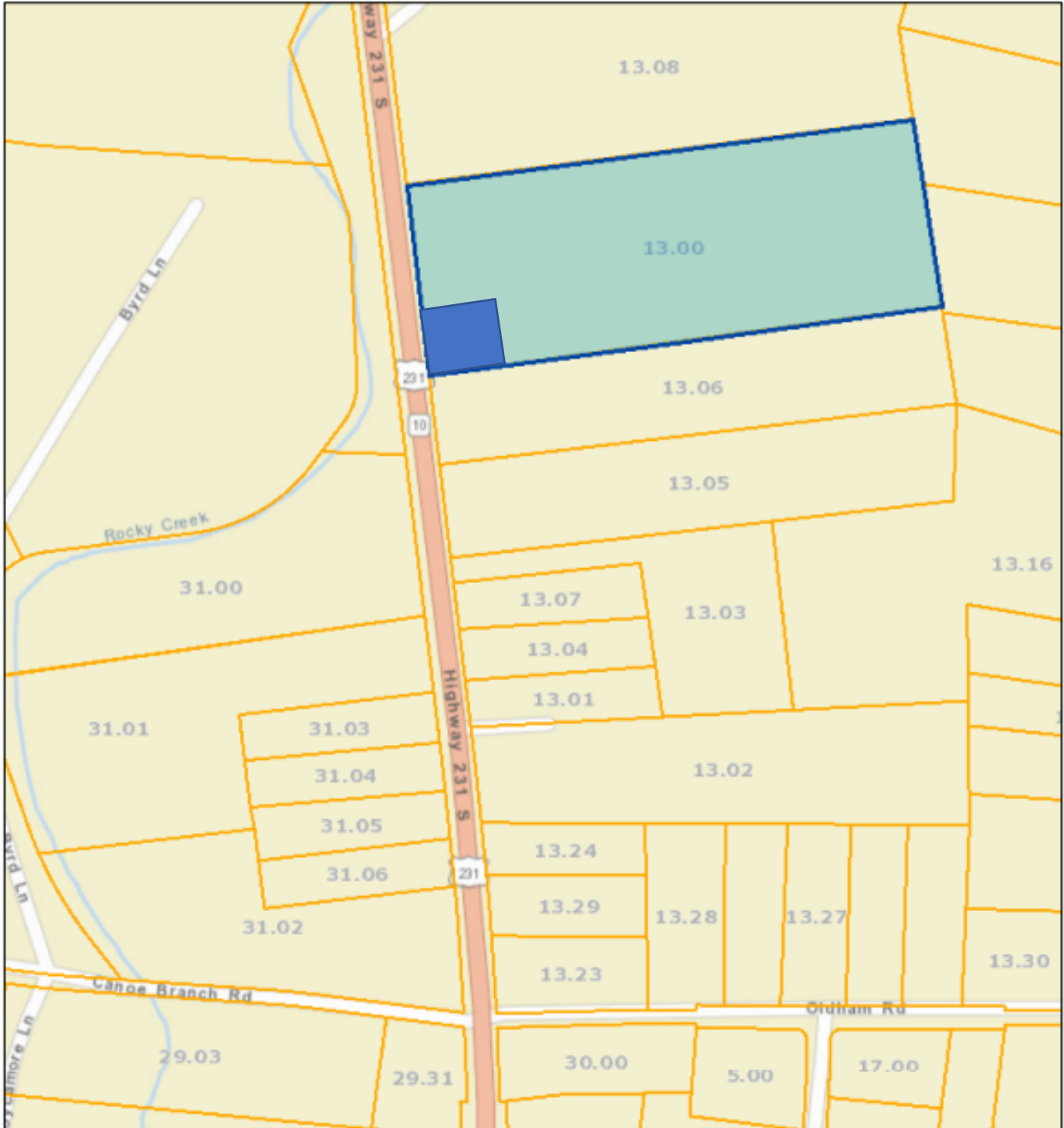
