

SALARY ORDINANCES ADOPTED FOR SALARIES FOR 1991

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE WARREN COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING IN A SPECIAL SESSION HEREBY ADOPTS THE FOLLOWING SALARIES OF THE VARIOUS OFFICES TO BE APPROPRIATED FOR THE BUDGET YEAR OF 1991 PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE PUBLIC LAW 249:

SALARIES: COUNCILMAN DICK DOBBELS MADE A MOTION TO MAINTAIN SALARIES AT THE 1990 LEVEL (WITH EXCEPTIONS).

EXCEPTIONS: PROBATION OFFICER SALARY INCREASED TO \$23750 MANDATED BY STATE.

EXTENSION OFFICE HOLDERS GRANTED A \$510 RAISE AS RECOMMENDED BY PURDUE UNIVERSITY.

EXTRA HELP: MOTION MADE BY LEO MANN TO KEEP EXTRA HELP IN BUDGET THE SAME AS LAST YEAR \$35.00 PER DAY.

NEW POSITION IN THE CIRCUIT COURT BUDGET: MOTION MADE BY LEO MANN TO ALLOW 1/2 OF DEPUTY'S SALARY TO BE USED IN THIS POSITION - CHIEF PROBATION OFFICER. THE REMAINDER OF SALARY TO COME FROM MONIES COLLECTED IN FEES BY THE PROBATION.

HOURLY WAGES: A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN JOHN LAYTON TO HOLD THE LINE HERE ALSO BY ALLOWING NO INCREASES IN HOURLY WAGES AT HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND COUNTY HOME OR WHERE EVER APPLICABLE.

MOTION MADE BY JOHN LAYTON TO RETAIN THE 3/5'S DEPUTY POSITION IN THE SURVEYOR OFFICE AND AREA PLAN.
