

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-0223A

An Ordinance Declaring Certain Personal Property to be Surplus Property and Authorizing Its Transfer


WHEREAS, the Recorder of Warren County has certain used personal property, more particularly described as two (2) oak desks with no value, for which she no longer has use; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Warren County now deems such personal property to be "surplus property" with no value, and authorizes its transfer to a nonprofit corporation or charity pursuant to Indiana Code §5-22-22-6;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF WARREN COUNTY, INDIANA that the two (2) oak desks from the Recorder's office be deemed to surplus property, to be worthless, and may be transferred to Habitat for Humanity or a similar nonprofit corporation or charity, pursuant to Indiana Code §5-22-22-6.



Chapter 22. Disposition of Surplus Personal Property by a Governmental Body

IC 5-22-22-6

5-22-22-6 Public or private sale or transfer without advertising

Currentness

Sec. 6. If the property to be sold is:

- (1) one (1) item, with an estimated value of less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000); or
- (2) more than one (1) item, with an estimated total value of less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000);

the purchasing agency may sell the property at a public or private sale or transfer the property, without advertising.
